

Dr. Ramos' AI Policy

You may use the generative AI tool ChatGPT (or other similar AI tools that generate text) within the following limitations:

1. Idea generation (prewriting), outlining, and text editing for essays.
2. Minimum quoting as a supporting detail in a paragraph (one line or less).

If you use tools such as ChatGPT **to copy text** from the AI response in any part of the writing, you **must properly cite** ChatGPT (or similar AI tool).

You are also responsible for fact checking the accuracy of statements copied from the AI response. Failure to fact-check and cite is considered a violation of the student's "Responsibility" as detailed in [Dallas College Code of Student Conduct](#). Violations could result in failure of the assignment or failure of the course.

If you are unable to fact-check and correctly cite, then DO NOT use AI tools to generate paragraphs to avoid your writing assignments be flagged as "plagiarized."
